- Assessing the direct and indirect impacts of our operations and value chain on biodiversity, and implementing measures to prevent and mitigate adverse impacts.
- Supporting the responsible sourcing of forest risk commodities and strengthening responsible sourcing practices in line with our approach to preventing deforestation and land conversion.
- Collaborating with our suppliers, producers, and other business partners to promote the conservation of natural resources, sustainable agricultural practices, and the protection of biodiversity.
- Supporting initiatives that contribute to the protection of water resources, soil, and ecosystems, while undertaking actions to reduce the environmental impacts of our operations.
- Promoting the efficient use of natural resources by advancing energy, water, waste management, and circular economy practices, thereby contributing to reducing pressure on ecosystems.

- Monitoring national and international developments related to biodiversity and continuously improving our policies and practices in line with scientific approaches and recognized best practices.
- Supporting collaboration with public institutions, academia, non-governmental organizations, suppliers, and other stakeholders to contribute to the conservation of biodiversity.
